This style guide is based on the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* [Reference BF 76.7 .P83 2001]. Washington: American Psychological Association, 2001. APA (American Psychological Association) style is most commonly used to cite sources within the social sciences.

This *Style Guide* is only intended as an example; there are many other APA citation formats. Please consult the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* itself, if you need additional help.

Music Recording	Songwriter, W. W. (Date of copyright). Title of song [Recorded by artist if different from song writer]. On <i>Title of album</i> [Medium of recording]. Location: Label. (Recording date if different from copyright date).
